

# Michigan Muslim Community Council

The Michigan Muslim Community Council (MMCC) is a representative forum of the Michigan's Muslim community. In the 1980's, metro-Detroit's Muslim community embarked on the critical task of bringing Muslim communities under a single umbrella. The Muslim leadership began work on the creation of a Council, bringing together partners from multiple Muslims sects, ethnicities and races. The Council of Islamic Organizations of Michigan was established in 1988, and was formally incorporated in 1993.



CIOM focused on efforts to unite the Muslim community since the 1980s. The very first organized efforts of the developing Council was an annual Eid Unity Banquet in celebration of the end of Ramadan. Since that time, CIOM branched into numerous other important services, including statewide open houses for Michigan's many mosques, extensive outreach effort working with civic and interfaith groups across the state, developing a strong relationship with local print and broadcast media, establishing halal food guidelines on a statewide level, and establishing the Imam's Council.

A parallel council, Islamic Shura Council of Michigan (ISCOM), was established in 2005 to focus on community service projects. ISCOM developed partnerships with many non-profits, including the free healthcare clinic, HUDA, Muslim Family Services, and Islamic Relief, one of America's largest Muslim charitable organizations. The Shura Council helped rehabilitate numerous inner-city mosques and feed thousands through their annual Udhiya/Qurbani (ritual sacrificed meat) program, and Humanitarian Day programs. Their Day of Goodness raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for local service projects that benefited the underprivileged in this area.

In 2012, CIOM & ISCOM merged, and formed the Michigan Muslim Community Council (MMCC). The MMCC is a representative forum of the Michigan's Muslim community. MMCC's Board of Directors come from every major ethnicity, sectarian groups and nonprofit within the Muslim community. An Advisory Council assists the Board of Directors in remaining connected with the community. MMCC is supported by resources from generous community members, partner organizations and grants. MMCC hired full-time staff in 2013. They are supported by dozens of volunteers and interns.

MMCC is committed to unifying and coordinating Michigan's Muslim communities, promoting Islamic and American values to help better our state and advocating for social justice. MMCC will work to enhance and develop needed programs in the community that will improve the state of the people of Michigan, In sha Allah (as God wills)







## Our Staff



### Keynote Speaker

#### Linda Sarsour

Linda Sarsour is a working woman, racial justice and civil rights activist, and mother of three. Ambitious, outspoken and independent, Linda shatters stereotypes of Muslim women while also treasuring her religious and ethnic heritage. She is a Palestinian Muslim American and a self-proclaimed "pure New Yorker, born and raised in Brooklyn!"

Linda is the Executive Director of the Arab American Association of New York and Senior Strategist for the Campaign to Take on Hate. In the wake of the police murder of Mike Brown, she co-founded Muslims for Ferguson to build solidarity amongst American Muslim communities and encourage work against police brutality. Linda is also the co-founder of the Muslim Democratic Club of New York, the first of its kind in New York City. She has received numerous awards and honors including "Champion of Change" by the White House, the New York City Council's Shirley Chisholm Women of Distinction Award and received the inaugural American Muslim of the Year honor from the Council on American Islamic Relations. Linda is also a board member of the New York Immigration Coalition, a coalition of over 200 nonprofit agencies serving the diverse immigrant communities of New York State and the Network of Arab American Professionals-NY Chapter.



She has been profiled by PBS, Yahoo News, NY1's One on One With Budd Mishkin and the Guardian. She recently completed a successful campaign to have the Muslim Eid holidays officially recognized by the New York City. And for her many accomplishments, the Royal Islamic Strategic Studies Center named her one of the 500 most influential Muslims in the world.

Fatina Abdrabboh, J.D. M.P.P, M.T.S., the Director of the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee's (ADC) Michigan office, is a graduate of Harvard University, the University of Pennsylvania, and the University of Michigan-Ann Arbor. As Director of the largest civil rights organization defending the rights of Arab-Americans, her work has primarily focused on identifying unique challenges facing the Arab-American community and reconciling their needs with the fundamental values enshrined in the United States Constitution. Fatina's work has appeared in leading periodicals including the New York Times, Christian Science Monitor, the Detroit Free Press, the Washington Times, and others. She is also assisting the CBS station with its Peabody-nominated "Eye on the Future" initiative which was launched to take on important issues that impact the community with an eye towards long-term impact.

As part of that she has written/produced and hosted "Eye on the Future" TV specials for CBS on critical issues such as "Building Bridges: From

The Great Lakes To The Great Wall, "Powering Michigan's Future, "RX For Michigan" "Reinventing Michigan," The Health Care Act and You," "Detroit's Next Chapter," "Michigan in Transition" and "Michigan: Our Water, Our Future."

Carol is also an award-winning columnist at Detroit Free Press, writing about business, politics and more. She has carved a path spotlighting the importance of diversity and inclusion throughout her career. She has written numerous exclusive articles and columns that talk about the importance of building bridges throughout the community and also to places like China.

She has served as national editor, political editor, business editor and columnist at Detroit Free Press, business editor at Toledo Blade, business reporter and nationally-syndicated columnist at The Detroit News, and reporter and editor at United Press International where she covered sports, autos and politics.

She can also be heard offering commentary on politics, business and community issues on local and national broadcast outlets.

The Muslim community is particularly thankful for her fair portrayal of Muslims, Arabs and new Americans. She has repeatedly recognized the importance of having a diverse community and the value brought by immigrants to America. She brought MMCC Board members onto her show to discuss the 2014 Islamic Society of North America convention in Detroit. She also made time out of her busy schedule to attend and emcee Michigan Muslim Capitol Day in 2014, inspiring many young students to get their voices heard.

Born in Detroit, she attended Detroit Public Schools. She obtained her BA in Communications from Michigan State University and MBA from the University of Michigan.

#### **Syed Salman Community Service Award**

#### Islamic Relief USA



Islamic Relief USA (IRUSA) is awarded the Annual Syed Salman Community Service Award for its outstanding work in Detroit and beyond for two decades. IRUSA distributes over \$60 million in aid across the world annually and has a 4 star rating by Charity Navigator. Based in Virginia, it has invested heavily in metro Detroit. In particular, during the water shut off crisis in Detroit last year, Islamic Relief partnered with MMCC to provide \$100,000 in water relief to United way of Southeastern Michigan and Wayne Metro Community Council to help relieve some of Detroit's hardest hit residents.

Islamic Relief also partners annually with MMCC to help with the annual meat distribution from the Oedhiya and Qurbani programs at Eid. This year, IRUSA donated over 30,000 pounds of meat which was distributed by MMCC to local needy families at 25 mosques, food pantries and partner service organizations such as Zaman International, Muslim Family Services and the Detroit Muslim Mission. IRUSA collects its donations from across the United States and chooses to invest the a significant portion of the donations in Metro Detroit.

IRUSA has many other investments in Michigan. It has been a regular sponsor of the annual Day of Dignity, where hundreds of local Detroiters benefit from care packages, health screening and food distributions. This year, the event took place in September at the Muslim Center of Detroit. IRUSA also conducted a series of workshops for Disaster Assistance Relief Training. The



extended training sessions spanning several days gave certification for local residents to become formal disaster relief workers. These workers have been used previously during the Katrina and Sandy hurricanes. They were among the first relief workers on the ground when Detroit and Dearborn faced flooding last year, and are ready to respond to disasters across this country and world.

IRUSA has promoted community development by being a regular sponsor of many local activities, particularly among the youth. Through the sponsorship of workshops, camps, banquets and more, IRUSA allows local youth to become better educated about



their faith, gain exposure to community organizing and develop critical leadership skills. Many of the youth who organized dinners for Islamic Relief go on to serve other non-profits, including MMCC. Islamic Relief has sponsored and supported critical local youth events including, the Michigan Muslim Youth Council Annual Conference, Camp Al-Hilal and last years recipients of the community service award, the Michigan Interscholastic Tournament (MIST).

As residents of Michigan, we thank IRUSA for its dedication to helping the disadvantaged, and the foresight to realize that many of those who need help are actually our neighbors. IRUSA embodies the spirit of relentless community service of the late Br. Syed Salman, one of our great pioneers in the Muslim community. We pray IRUSA continues its good works into the future.

# Interfaith Partner Award

## Jim Tuman

Jim Tuman is the 2015 recipient of the Michigan Muslim Council Interfaith award. Jim Tuman embodies the interfaith spirit, which harnesses the goodness in all our faiths to make a positive impact on the world.

Jim was born in New York in the 1940's and travelled across the world as he tried to learn about people. Along the way, he performed many jobs, including rodeo clown, rock band roadee, cake decorator, symphony musician and relief worker in Ethiopia. He graduated from Michigan State with a degree in sociology, and eventually found his calling as an advocate for children, women and veterans. He has spoken to over 2 million children in over 2000 schools, and has taken his message to the airways on places like the Today Show, Oprah, and many other important news programs and papers. Most recently, he gave a Ted Talk at Tedx Bay City. He has been recognized as Michiganian of the Year in 2005 and Distinguished Alumni at MSU in 2012.

His is a message of hope and perseverance. He is able to connect with those who feel ostracized, bullied or neglected, and helps them turn their lives around and use their experiences as a source of strength. It is this same passion to help those on the margins that allow him to see the importance

of supporting the Muslim community which is facing

rising levels of hate and bigotry. He encouraged the Muslim Council to join his local effort to help children in Southwest Detroit, Jimmy's Kids, during their Christmas gift distribution alongside the Jewish community.



In the first year of this multi faith collaboration, Jimmy had fallen ill with pneumonia and was hospitalized. Despite doctor's order, however, he left the hospital to join the hundreds gathered that cold morning in 2006 to welcome the crowd and thank them for their work.

The Muslim Volunteer Day and Jewish Mitzvah Day on Christmas have blossomed with the support of people like Jim Tuman. He truly values the diversity of faiths and works to allow others to do so also. He embodies the Quranic verse, "We have made you from a male and a female, and made you into nations and tribes, so that you may know one another. The noblest of you in the sight of God are those of you who are righteous."

#### Keynote Speaker: Rashida Tlaib



With the belief that everyone, not just the wealthy and privileged, deserwith the belief inter-level view, but the weathy and principled, uces was access to opportunity and a better quality of life, Rashida Tlaib has dedicated her life to amplifying the concerns of the marginalized in Detroit, and across the state and country. Rashida made history in 2008 by becoming the first

the state and country. Rashida made history in 2008 by becoming the first Muslim woman elected to the Michigan Legislature, and only the second Muslim state legislator in the country. She quickly became a leader amongst her pers and was appointed as the ranking Democrat on the Appropriations Committee. The Detroit Free Press and Detroit News recognized her service when they said, respectively, "Rashida has an unshakable work ethic" and "there's no harder worker or stronger voice for her constituents" belief that everyone, not, lust the wealthy and privileged, deserves access to opportunity. Rashida has been the recipient of numerous awards, including the Role Model Award from Alternatives for Girls, After School Champion national award, Calla Michigan's Empowering Muslims Award, Clean Water Action's Clean Water Hero award, recognized as one of Crain's Detroit Business Woman to Width and festive in DRSI "Makes Documentary on Woman in one of Crain's Detroit Business Women to Watch and featured in PBS' Makers Documentary on Women in Politics. She is currently the Community Partnerships and Development Director at the Sugar Law Center for Economic & Social Justice and manages the Campaign to Take on Hate, a racial justice movement to prevent the increase of hate crimes in the U.S. Rashida received her bachelor's in political science from Wayne State University and her law degree from Thomas Cooley Law School. She lives in Southwest Detroit

#### Special Guest Speaker: Justice Stephen J. Markman



Stephen Markman was appointed Justice of the Michigan Supreme Court on October 1, 1999. Before his appointment, he served as Judge on the Michigan Court of Appeals from 1995-1999. Prior to this, he practiced law with the firm of Miller, Canfield, Paddock & Stone in Detroit. From 1989-93, Justice Markman served as United States Attorney, or federal prosecutor. Justice Markman served as United States Artorney, or receral prosecutor, in Michigan, after having been nominated by President George H. W. Bush and confirmed by the United States Senate. From 1985-1989, he served as Assistant Attorney General of the United States, after having been nominated by President Ronald Reagan and confirmed by the United States Senate. In that position, he headed the Department of Justice's Office of Legal Policy,

which served as the principal policy development office within the Department, and which coordinated the federal judicial selection process. Prior to this, he served for seven years as Chief Counsel of the United States Senate Subcommittee on the Constitution, and as Deputy Chief Counsel of the United States Senate Judiciary Committee, Justice Markman has spoken before hundreds of youth, civic, charitable, and legal groups throughout Michigan and nationally, and has coached Little League baseball and begaingroups throughout Michigan and nationally, and has coached Little League baseball and basketball. He lives with his wife Mary Kathleen in Mason, and has two sons, James and Charles. Justice Markman was re-elected to the Supreme Court in 2000, 2004, and 2012. His present term expires January 1, 2021

# Amazing Michigan Muslim Zarinah El-Amin Naeem

"I found out that my goal is to create a global culture of love. That's my goal in life." - Zarinah El-Amin

Zarinah El-Amin Naeem is a social entrepreneur, anthropologist, and author of Jihad of the Soul: Singlehood and the Search for Love in Muslim America. When we asked her to describe her background, she began by crediting her parents, saying, "My parents were very active in the community, so we were the children of the masjid. We grew up with the mentality of giving back to the community. That is,

the Muslim community as well as the broader community. That was our upbringing." She is dedicated to building bridges of understanding amongst people, and that is what makes her an amazing Michigan Muslim.

Although Zarinah takes pride in being born and raised in Detroit, it was her experiences traveling and working in Africa that sparked her curiosity about human commonalities and differences. In Egypt, she experienced racism and discrimination that she was often protected from in her local community back home. She took a job with LIFE for Relief and Development as Africa Programs Coordinator, stationed in Sierra Leone. When she returned, her desire to get to know humans on a deeper level led her to study anthropology.

"I look at headwraps not only as religious symbols but as a way for us to get to know one another. I'm Muslim, and I'm wearing something on my head. I see a Rastafarian with something on their head, then I see a Jewish person with something on their head, and a Sikh with something on their head. All these people are doing the exact same thing, which is referencing their lord, but in different ways. I want to use head covering to bring all these folks together."

Zarinah is the founder of an interfaith organization called Beautifully Wrapped. The organization has two goals: to build love, understanding, and respect among people, and to utilize fashion as a means of sparking economic development in Detroit and West Africa. Every year,



Beautifully Wrapped hosts an event called the Headwrap Expo. The event is comprised of fashion shows, interfaith panels, and a marketplace. Zarinah explains that the Headwrap Expo is a more organic approach to interfaith dialogue. Rather than pushing people to talk about issues, it brings people together in a lighthearted manner and allows them to get to know one another for who they really are.

"We as Muslims have something to offer, and it is incumbent upon us to put it out there"

She is also known for self-publishing her own book, called Jihad of the Soul: Singlehood and the Love in Muslim America. In the book, she interviews Muslims from around the country about their views on marriage. The book has been a success and is now being used as a required text in the university setting, for use by Muslims and other groups. The experience of publishing her book led her to found NIYAH Publishing, in which she helps others publish their own works. She stresses the importance of not only making a profit, but benefitting others and "contributing to the positive evolution of society" as she puts it.

"Whatever your strengths are, there is a place for them. Find your strengths and utilize them to find peace."

When we asked Zarinah if she had any advice for the young Muslim women who want to serve their communities but may be struggling to self-actualize, she stressed that for the younger generation at large, the key is to be honest with ourselves about strengths and weaknesses. Many of us try to bring peace to others and please others before finding peace within ourselves, and this may lead to resentment and unnecessary stress. She also emphasized the importance of seeking knowledge, saying "it's not cool to be "Islamically dumb"". Sister Zarinah has proven to be a great role model for the youth of our community and we look forward to seeing the positivity she will inspire.

# Amazing Michigan Muslim Asif Malik

"It is important to represent who you are and where you're from. It is a common saying that if you're not at the table, you're on the table..." -Asif Malik

Asif Malik is a pediatric anesthesiologist working for the Henry Ford Health System, but that is only part of the reason he was chosen as this month's Amazing Michigan Muslim. Aside from his career as an anesthesiologist, Dr. Malik has participated in various community involvement initiatives in health and beyond. As an individual, he manages to find his own unique methods, based on his own specific talents, to give back to our community. He encourages us all to do the same, and that is why he is this month's Amazing Michigan Muslim.

"I'd say that if you have to write about someone, you should write about my father as opposed to me."

Dr. Asif Malik was born in Detroit, Michigan to Pakistani immigrants. He begins the interview by attributing his personal successes to his parents, particularly his father, Dr. Ghaus Malik, He credits him as his primary role model in life. Although his father is a neurosurgeon, Dr. Malik claims that his father never pushed him or his siblings toward medicine. Rather, he says his father would tell him to do whatever he wanted as long as he was excelling at it, for mediocrity was unacceptable. His father was also a founder of the Islamic Association of Greater Detroit in Rochester Hills, which set the stage for Asif and his siblings to understand the importance of institution building and giving back to the community. When talking about his parents, Dr. Malik stressed that we are products of our parents, and that as parents we have a duty to counsel our children wisely and raise them with values of selflessness and care for others. Parents must lead by the prophetic example and encourage their kids to do the same. He makes special note of the humility of his parents, saying "One thing I got from my parents is that every person should be treated the same. Never think that you are above anyone."

Although he is busy with his duties in the hospital and outside of it, Dr. Malik still makes time to engage and serve his community. He stresses the importance of Muslims being an active and positive part of the fabric of American society, and to him that means we must be visual in our efforts to help the community at large. We must serve as leaders within the public sphere, as helpers of humanity rather than just helpers of our own groups per se. According to Dr. Malik, we must add positivity to the conversation about Muslims, and we do this by standing up and taking initiative. He presently serves as the President-elect of IMANA, the Islamic Medical Association of North America. He is also part of the Board of Directors for the Michigan Society of Anesthesiologists and the American Red Cross Southeast Michigan chapter, for which he



has been helping to organize blood drives within the Muslim community since high school.

"We have to be active participants in society and you don't have to be in medicine to do that"

As part of Dr. Malik's volunteer efforts, he and other doctors frequently embark on medical missions to various foreign countries as a part of IMANA. That is his way of giving back through volunteering, yet he wanted to make a point to the audience that volunteering knows no profession. He shared a story of a surgical mission he recently returned from Sudan, in which 186 cases of cleft lip and palate deformities were corrected

in five days. This wonderful effort however, was not undertaken by doctors alone. This time they were joined by Oday Aboushi, a Palestinian-American offensive tackle from the NFL's New York Jets. By no means is Aboushi a medical professional. Rather, he is a professional football player. Yet, he was still able to help out in the effort by using his 6'6, 300 pound frame to hold down any unruly patients, translate Arabic, and by the end, even hook up IVs and draw blood. The point is that there are many things we can do to volunteer. Everyone has a talent. Whatever that talent may be, use it for good. Get out there and volunteer!

"Why do we need to ask for assistance? As a community, we are affluent financially and in numbers. People say the Muslim population in southeast Michigan is going down. I just don't see that.."

Like many of us, Dr. Malik is the son of immigrants and represents the first generation of American Muslims. He is grateful for the foundation our parents built for us, but he realizes that a common vision is needed for a better future. To him, that future is centered on parenting. His goal in life is to ensure that his children have a better upbringing than he did, and that they are able to balance life as great Americans as well as great Muslims. He recognizes that some people may not have the capacity to visit the mosque daily, but that shouldn't mean that those people cannot be equally good representatives of Islam. He encourages his own children to live to the prophetic example as ambassadors, not necessarily preachers. He extends this advice to all the youth.

Dr. Malik also has a vision for fellow Muslim medical professionals. He acknowledges the efforts of local physicians in the Huda Clinic, a Muslim-run free health clinic in Detroit, yet he believes that it is not enough. He believes that Muslim doctors have an even bigger duty, especially since most mosques in the region have been founded by and are sustained by physicians. He recommends a consolidated effort to promote networking amongst physicians to provide free health care to the disadvantaged. Overall, Dr. Malik is optimistic about the state of our community and we look forward to improving it together.

## Amazing Michigan Muslim

## **Fatina Abdrabboh**

"Advocacy is one of those values we always embraced. Advocating for people; speaking on behalf of people that are not able to speak for themselves." - Fatina Abdrabboh

On September 12, 2001, Fatina Abdrabboh was a 20 year-old college student at the University of Michigan-Ann Arbor. In the suddenly charged political climate, Abdrabboh and her peers were thrust into the spotlight and thrown under the microscope. Visibly Muslim people like her found themselves at the forefront of perspectives on Muslim Americans. The responsibility of protecting the Arab-American and Muslim narrative in America from bigotry, hatred, and misunderstanding weighed heavily on her in those impressionable times. She describes that obligation as the force which has taken her across the country and globe in the last decade and a half since 9-11 giving dozens of lectures and public addresses. She went on to Harvard University, where she says she learned "how to think about what to think". Today, as Executive Director of the American Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee (ADC) Michigan Regional Office, the largest grassroots organization in the country representing the civil rights of Arab Americans, she continues to stand up for the rights of Arabs and Muslims in a time when representation is of utmost importance. Attorney Fatina Abdrabboh serves our community by striving for its equal and just treatment, and for that she is our Amazing Michigan Muslim of the Month.

Growing up as the daughter of Palestinian immigrants, Fatina understood the concept of struggling for justice from a young age. Her and her family would sit around the dinner table and discuss issues of social justice. According to Fatina, it was her self-criticizing atmosphere and "measuring herself against herself" that was key in propelling her through her education and to her current position. She ended up at Harvard and University of Pennsylvania where she describes her experience as interactive with some of the world's brightest minds and learned from their world views. When asked what she gained from her law school education, she explained that law school can give an individual a "truly discerning critical eye".

"If we are always reactive instead of proactive in protecting our community then we are doing something wrong."

When Fatina took over as Director of the ADC her focus was on strengthening the



voice of the community through advocacy and the 3 E's (Education, Engagement, and Empowerment). Under her leadership, ADC handles all types of cases regarding discrimination, including many involving people in schools and businesses, targeted by ethnic slurs and unfair treatment. When an Arab American is being discriminated against, Fatina has committed herself to making sure ADC is the go-to organization that can stand up for their rights. She stresses that in order for our community to move forward, we have to shift from merely identifying problems to organizing around solving them. And she is certainly doing that as a public intellectual voice. Fatina's writings are frequently seen in national newspapers and her opinion on national and international affairs makes her a regular on television and radio programs.

"The status of Civil rights is the number one issue facing Arabs and Muslims in America"

Fatina describes the threat to civil rights as the most prevalent issue facing Muslims today, and not just because she is a civil rights attorney. She explains that the increase in discrimination will cause a ripple effect that infiltrates all facets of our society in America. When asked how the law can be used to defend our civil rights, she said "Law is a powerful tool if it is understood and applied fairly and applied by an advocate in such

a way to protect rights. We need Muslim American civil rights lawyers to make sure the law is upheld and equally applied to our communities".

"To truly empower people is to encourage them to seek what may otherwise seem like a unattainable, daunting pursuit. Help them see beyond those barriers and navigate through their difficulty of making choices. We need to provide resources, encouragement, and support to encourage people today and future leaders tomorrow."

Fatina is very clear that her vision for the future of our community is centered on the status of our youth. This focus has earned her many awards including most recently from the NAACP and another from the Arab Student Union at the University of Michigan, where she will be teaching a course on Arab American civil rights. She encourages the elders of our community to understand the need to support the youth, saying "our best interest is to support them as university students have historically been the breeding ground for change". She stresses empowerment of the youth, but also implores the youth to dream and think big themselves; working hard to achieve their goals without being distracted by naysayers. She advises the youth of our community to respect and embrace the values of the past generations we were so fortunate to grow from, while harmoniously blending the unique perspectives of the day with the ways of old. She also delivers a stern warning to the youth against judging others, for judging others is a way that we destroy our own communities from the inside.

"We have a rich heritage that we must all be proud of it. But in order to embrace it we must learn it and know all about it. I will teach my children their background so they can define themselves, else they risk being defined"

When asked about characteristics of a leader, she described three facets of leadership that we should all reflect on. She says, "a leader is only as good as the people he or she empowers, only as good as the example they set in their conduct in what they say and do, and is one who by definition cultivates a skill set, vision, and perspective to equip those who will come after with a torch that will sustain and maintain." We'd like to extend our gratitude to Attorney Fatina Abdrabboh for exemplifying outstanding leadership, and encouraging us to do the same.


## Amazing Michigan Muslim

## **Ahmad Rahman**

Professor Ahmad Rahman is recognized as an Amazing Michigan Muslim for his many sacrifices and great work for civil rights and education. He passed away at age 64 in September of 2015.

Ahmad Rahman grew up a bright young student in Chicago. Rather than go to college - he was accepted to Harvard - he joined the Black Panther Party in 1971. He became the target of the infamous FBI COINTELPRO operations and was convicted of assault and murder during efforts to stop drug dealers in Detroit neighborhoods. He was put into prison with a life sentence without parole. After a nationwide campaign to release him with much participation from the local Muslim community, Governor Engler exonerated him in 1992.

Since then Ahmad became a scholar of African American studies and a community activist, While in prison, he obtained a bachelor's degree in Urban Studies. After his release, he went on to earn a PhD in African American Studies and joined the faculty of the



University of Michigan in Dearborn. He was an enthusiastic and engaged educator with a significant impact on many of his students. The Michigan Council of Social Studies named him College Professor of the Year in 2013.

He remained committed to social change and civil rights. He served on the board of the Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History in Detroit and led a initiative with the Detroit Public Schools to teach African American history to grade schoolers..

He said, "At one time during my youth I called myself a revolutionary. Now I see myself as more of a solutionary." His freedom and successes was always a reminder that organized community action DOES make a difference. May God accept his good work.

## Amazing Michigan Muslim

# **Sir Michael Berry**


Michael Berry passed away in October of 2015 at the young age of 95, and he is recognized as an Amazing Michigan Muslim. Michael Berry was born in Highland Park to Lebanese immigrant parents. After some initial moves around this country and a brief stay in Lebanon, Michael moved back to Michigan to reside in Dearborn where he graduated from the Detroit College of Law in 1949 to become one of the first Muslims to practice law in Michigan.

After spending years specializing in municipal law, he was appointed to the Wayne County Road Commission in 1967 and eventually became the chairman, where he oversaw the creation of the vast transportation infrastructure around Wayne county. One of his crowning achievements was the expansion of the Detroit Metropolitan Airport, which made it one of the 10 largest airports in the country.



The Michael Berry International Terminal at the airport was named after him, and a commemorative plaque is still present in the new North Terminal.

Michael Berry dedicated much of his life to public service. In addition to serving Wayne County, he was also a political activist serving as the 16th Congressional District's Democratic Chairman for many years. He mentored and supported many rising lawyers and activists. He spent time supporting numerous non-profits by serving on the Board of St Jude's Children's Research Hospital and the March of Dimes. He also furthered interfaith understanding with his representation of the Muslim community as the co-chairperson of the Greater Detroit Conference of Christians Jews and Muslims.



He was recognized for his many contributions by being awarded the Ellis Island Medal of Honor in 1998, and the National Order of Cedar of Lebanon by the government of Lebanon in 1993, its highest civilian honor. In Dearborn Heights, the Michael Berry Career Center provides a large, modern facility for job training and classes for the community, exemplifying his lifelong work of bringing out the best in people and institutions. His advice to young students starting in their careers: "Get out early and establish yourself. Work from sunrise to sunset, like I did. Let people know who you are. Get to know people!" May God accept his good work.

Dr. Abdulmunim Shakir was born May 19, 1924 in Egypt. He migrated to the US in the forties and eventually obtained a Ph.D. in Political Science. He was fascinated by the US constitution and was able to bring out the similarities between it and the Islamic teachings from the Quran.

He dedicated himself to education and specifically educating inner-city youngsters. He taught in several states before settling down in Michigan in the seventies. He established the "Muslim World Studies" program at Wayne County Community College, where he introduced many thousands of students to Islam and the Arabic language. He taught US history and political science for about three decades at WCCC, with a short time also spent at the United Nations.

He was involved in many Muslim projects in the Detroit area. He taught at several Islamic Sunday schools, both in Sunnah and Shia' mosques. He held close to his heart the saying of Prophet SAWS "If you do a deed you need to perfect it." He always strove to be perfect and instill the love of perfection in his students. He held several leadership positions in Islamic organizations across the US but was particularly proud of his affiliation and support to the local Islamic Cultural Institute for which he served as President for several terms.

Dr. Abdulmunim Shakir passed away February 2, 2006. Because of his strong belief in the value of education, Dr. Shakir arranged for a Scholarship Fund to be established to support Freshmen students in their first year of higher education. This program is administered by ISNA and is funded by the Abdulmunim Shakir Charitable Trust.

Dr. Shakir dedicated the majority part of his life in promoting an increased understanding of Islam in America, and in building bridges of unity among people of different faiths regardless of race, creed, country of origin, or ethnicity. His life's work continues to be felt by the today's generation. Please pray for his soul and his family.
